IQAC initiated the Department of PG Studies in commerce organized one day work shop on Ethical issues in technology adaption Program for M.com Students for the academic batch 2019-20 was held in Lecture Hall 8 09-10-2019 at 10:30AM. The Formal Inaugural Session started with welcome address to Resource person, Principal, IQAC Co-coordinator, Faculties, & Students by Dr Kittu R S.

The objective of the workshop is how ethical frameworks and concerns arise within digital technologies and examines the implementation of ethics by governments and private companies. It concludes by proposing a forward-looking approach and identifying potential challenges to implement ethics within the design and use of digital technologies.

Resource Person: Mr. Gowtham S Faculty of KLE Degree College

The resource person discussed about the omnipresence of digital technology in our daily life, its use and its impact on organisations and individuals raises ethical questions about its role in our society. These concerns include consent and privacy, security, inclusion and fairness, protection from online harm, transparency and accountability. Notable examples include the Cambridge Analytical scandal and concerns about racial discrimination in the design of facial recognition algorithms. Taking into account ethical considerations is essential to ensure that digital technologies benefit as many people as possible.

The maturity of the ethical approach depends largely on the type of technology. The ethics of block chain and cloud services seem globally at the stage of academic research, while the ethics of technologies such as smart phones, robots and artificial intelligence are more subject to recommendations from States or to enterprise self-regulation. Certain regulatory frameworks exist or are under development concerning platforms and their related subjects such as data privacy and online harms.

At the end of the session the students cleared their doubts by asking various questions regarding the confusions.
